## International Conference "Costumes and Collections in the Context of Cultural Heritage. Sharing Art, Crafts, and Preservation", Romania

Organized by ASTRA Museum, Sibiu (Romania), on 26-29 September 2023, the event included a special panel dedicated to discussions about the traditional costumes making in the context of living heritage. Speakers from Albania, Azerbaijan, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Germany, Norway, Romania, Serbia, U.K. presented the current situation of elements inscribed on the UNESCO 2003 Convention lists or on national inventories connected to ethnic clothing handicrafts, and the challenges encountered by craftspeople and representative communities that transmit this type of living heritage. The panel was organized under the patronage of the Romanian UNESCO Commission and the Ministry of Culture of Romania.



#### Europe

Tracks4Crafts is a research project that has been initiated this spring and aims to promote the continuity and longevity of crafts. Through experiments in so-called 'pilot cases' we test several tools, formats and instruments that can help the transmission of traditional crafts knowledge to safeguard not only the crafts but also intangible skills and knowledge that characterizes craftsmanship. The University of Antwerp coordinates this research collaboration of 15 partners (of research institutes, heritage- and umbrella organizations) from 10 different countries. The four-year trajectory is funded by Horizon Europe, an initiative of the European Commission.

### Dance as ICH: New models of facilitating participatory dance events

The project is co-founded by the European Union, that involves nine partners from six countries (Norway, Slovenia, Hungary, Romania, Greece, Belgium) and is coordinated by the Norwegian Centre for Traditional Music and Dance (Sff). The project aims to establish new or renewed models for facilitating participatory dance events as a co-creative process in call from heritage communities and to develop innovative methods, processes and arenas for participatory folk dancing as ICH in the 21st century.


